

"I believe we're going to be more successful than what people think," head coach Joev Hammer said.

"Nothing is going to surprise me with these guys," he said, considering how much Friday night experience the team brings.

Snohomish was plagued with injuries early in the season, Hammer said. They went 2-8 overall in 2023.



With a lot of returners, the Glacier Peak Grizzlies are looking to make a run in the postseason in 2024.

"We think we can make a big run into the playoffs. We have high expectations," Glacier Peak Head Coach Shane Keck said, noting the team has a talented group of se-

Senior Lucas Entler returns as quarterback for the team's power spread offense. Entler was second-team, all-conference in 2023. He is smart and distributes the ball well, Keck said. "He does a really good job with what we ask him to do."

Keck highlighted left tackle Connor Aney. Aney is 6-foot-3, 290 pounds and is a two-time state heavyweight wrestling champion. "He understands how to use his body and knows leverage."

He described the starting running backs, senior Francis Crocker and junior Isaiah Owens, as a "thunder and lightning" combination. 'Those two guys will be a dynamic 1-2 punch for us," Keck said.

Glacier Peak runs a 3-4 defense. Keck highlighted outside linebackers senior Nolan

Monroe aims to build on momentum

The Monroe High School Bearcats are aiming to build on their 9-2 record and playoff appearance from last year. The Bearcats lost to Bellevue High School in the playoffs, but are shooting to win the Wesco South Conference for a fourth straight year.

Head Coach Scott Darrow has one other objective: "Our goal is to get better every day and be the best version of ourselves every week," he said.

He's been impressed with the turnout and work the team has put in this offsea-

"We've had a great summer and spring and we brought 65 kids to PLU (Pacific Lutheran University) camp, and we've had great numbers in the weight room," Darrow said. He said the team saw 100 players turn out for the season.

Darrow is hoping to see big things from his star players, however several key playersfrom last season graduated.

He's confident in a core group on the roster expected to be significant contributors. Running back Carl Watson



is expected to play a significant role in Monroe's ground game, adding to the offense generated by wide receivers Mason Davis and Aaron Clifton.

Defensive lineman and tight end Brennan Shepard will anchor the Bearcats' defense in the trenches and contribute to the offense at the tight end spot.

The key players who graduated included their main quarterback Blake Springer, who plans to try out for the University of Montana football team in the spring. As a senior, Springer was 167 for

2,649 yards with 32 touch-

Other Monroe powerhouses who've graduated are solid running back Gavin Ranz, linebacker Biggie Notoa, one of the state's top linebackers, and wide receiver Ryan Miller, who'll play for George Fox University in Newberg, Oregon.

Springer said he believes the Bearcats will have a great season.

"I think the team has a chance at being great this year. A bunch of the starters have been playing for a

He played as a linebacker at the University of Washington, where he was inducted into the Huskies Hall of Fame, and made it to the NFL with the Minnesota Vikings and the CFL with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers during the early 1980s.
