Outside, each cabin features a picnic table, fire grill and RV hookup (cabin #1 has a 4' x 12' covered porch). Heated restrooms with showers are a short walk away.

Yurts are covered in canvas and include such amenities as electric outlets, skylights, wood floors, interior lighting, windows with screens, lockable doors, and outside decks. Each Yurt comes furnished with a futon, bunk bed, and coffee table. Outside each yurt you'll find a picnic table and fire ring. Yurt Villages include lighted

outlets, windows with walkways, a large group restroom with showers. Villages can accommodate group camping (families, clubs, companies, scouts, churches, schools, etc.). All yurts are smoke-free.

Take advantage of State Park Free Days



The Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission offers "free days in which dav-use visitors won't need a Discover Pass to visit state parks by vehicle.

The "free days" are in keeping with legislation that created the Discover Pass, a \$35 annual or \$11.50 one-day permit required on lands managed by Washington State Parks and the Washington departments of Natural Resources (DNR) and Fish & Wildlife (WDFW). The Discover Pass legislation provided that State Parks could designate up to 12 free days each year when the pass Lands Day would not be required to visit state parks.

Free days are a great way for people to discover Washington's diverse and scenic state parks. Once people visit a park, it is hoped they will be inspired to help support their state park system by buying a pass.

Explore Lord Hill Regional Park

Discover the Rain Forest in your own backyard

Throughout the winter Rain Forest is accessed by season, rain falls frequently in the Hoh Rain Forest, contributing to the yearly total of 140 to 170 inches (or 12 to 14 feet!) of precipitation each year. The result is a lush, green canopy of both coniferous and deciduous species. Mosses and ferns that blanket the surfaces add another dimension to the enchantment of the rainforest.

The Hoh Rain Forest is located in the stretch of the Pacific Northwest rainforest which once spanned the Pacific coast from southeastern Alaska to the central coast of California. The Hoh is one of the finest remaining examples of temperate rainforest in the United States and is one of the park's most popular destinations.

The Hoh Lake trail branches off from the Hoh River trail just after the ranger station and ascends to Bogachiel Peak The Hoh lies on the west between the Hoh and the Sol Duc Valley.

Minus tides are a big plus for viewing sea life typically protected by surf, and there will be no better viewing opportunity this summer than the dates listed in this article.

That's when the season's lowest tides arrive, along with thousands of area beachgoers.

give people a fascinating look at underwater marine life. There's no better time to creatures and how we can protect them while they are at protection. their most vulnerable.

isn't enough, many clam and oyster species are in their prime as they fatten up and enter their spawning cycle.

Shellfish gatherers are reminded that they must have a state shellfish license displayed on the outside of their clothing and dig only on public beaches.

For proper beach etiquette and to protect the vulnerable critters, remember these tips:

• Walk carefully. Look where you are stepping and avoid eelgrass beds, which are oceanside nurseries for many animals.

• Keep your pets under tight control.

• Don't take away rocks,

shells, seaweed, logs and other beach items, which are food and shelter for critters galore.

• If you move rocks to look underneath them, put them gently back just the way they were. Rocks protect lots of critters, many too small to see.

• Don't pull on animals like These extremely low tides anemones and barnacles that are tightly attached to rocks or pilings.
